

## POSSIBLE RISKS, HAZARDS or COMPLICATIONS

( Please READ and INITIAL )

	<b>PAIN:</b> There is a possibility of pain even after the topical anesthetic has been used. Anesthetics work better on some people than on others.
	<b>INFECTION:</b> Infection is very unusual. The areas treated must be kept clean and only freshly cleaned hands should touch the areas. See "After Care" Instructions.
	<b>UNEVEN PIGMENTATION:</b> This can result from poor healing, infection, bleeding, or many other causes. Your follow-up appointment will likely correct any uneven appearance. I understand that implanted pigment color can slightly change and fade over the due to circumstances beyond Studio420's and the artist's control (metabolism, skin type, medicine, age, smoking, alcohol, etc.) and that tanning, excessive sun exposure, manual/chemical exfoliation and the use of certain skin care products, such as AHA/BHA's (Retin-A, Renova, Alpha Hydroxy, Glycolic Acids, Lactic Acids, Salicylic Acids) can alter the color and cause premature exfoliation of the pigment.
	<b>ASYMMETRY:</b> Every effort will be made to avoid asymmetry, but our faces are not symmetrical, so adjustments may be needed during the follow-up session to correct any unevenness.
	<b>EXCESSIVE SWELLING OR BRUISING:</b> Some people bruise and swell more than others. Ice packs may help and the bruising and swelling typically disappears within 1-5 days. Most people don't bruise or swell at all.
	<b>ANESTHESIA:</b> Topical anesthetics are used to numb the area to be tattooed. Lidocaine, Prilocaine, Benzocaine, Tetracain, and Epinephrine in a liquid, cream or gel forms are typically used. If you are allergic to any of these, please inform your artist immediately before procedure begins.
	<b>MRI:</b> Because pigments used in permanent cosmetic procedures contain inert oxides, a low-level magnet may be required if you need to be scanned by an MRI machine. You must inform your technician of any tattoos or permanent cosmetics.
	<b>NO GUARANTEE</b> - I understand that Studio420 offers no guarantee on healed results and I may still need to use a cosmetic product to fill in my permanent make-up to the preference I have specified.
